

Health and Safety Policy Statement

NES is committed to providing a safe and healthy working environment for all employees, contractors and visitors and will “put safety at the forefront of everything we do”

We will:

- Establish and implement a health and safety management system to manage the risks associated with our activities and premises, regularly monitor our performance and revise our health and safety management system as necessary
- Actively promote a positive and an open attitude to health and safety issues, encouraging staff to identify and report hazards so that we can all contribute to creating and maintaining a safe working environment
- Listen to anyone who has something to say about Health & Safety
- Provide adequate information, training and instruction for our staff to enable them to work safely and effectively, and to ensure they are competent and confident in the work they carry out
- Ensure that responsibilities for health and safety are allocated, understood, monitored and fulfilled
- Carry out and regularly review risk assessments to identify hazards and existing control measures; we will prioritise, plan and complete any corrective actions required to reduce risk to an acceptable level
- Provide suitably qualified and experienced (SQEP) personnel to meet the requirements of current health and safety legislation and aim to achieve the standards of good practice applicable to our activities
- Incorporate and manage our plans for Health and Safety within our Continuous Sustainable Improvement Plans (CSIP)
- Maintain our premises and work equipment to a standard that ensures that risks are effectively managed
- Provide health surveillance for staff where appropriate, and maintain records
- Co-operate with other organisations in these premises or on our sites to ensure that they are aware of any risks to their staff and other people posed by our activities, that we are aware of any risks to our staff from their activities, and that we comply with the relevant requirements of relevant legislation.

The management representative, who has the appropriately defined role, authority and responsibility for establishing, implementing, and maintaining the Health & Safety Management System and for reporting on performance and recommendations for improvement is the QHSE Manager.

It is the duty of all of us when at work to:

- Take reasonable care of our own safety
- Take reasonable care of the safety of others who may be affected by what we do or fail to do
- Co-operate so that we can all comply with our legal duties
- Ensure we do not interfere with or misuse anything provided in the interests of health and safety.
